A number of alleged politically motivated killings, death-threats and violence have taken place in KwaZulu-Natal over the past year. This round table will address the question of political violence in KwaZulu-Natal in terms of two related aspects: assassination-type killings often claimed to be the result of factional battles, and the use of death threats or low-level violence in the pursuit of political ends. The discussion will explore some of the underlying issues that fuel these types of violence in our politics; the prospects for the future; and what churches and civil society can do to lessen the impact of this violence in our society?
